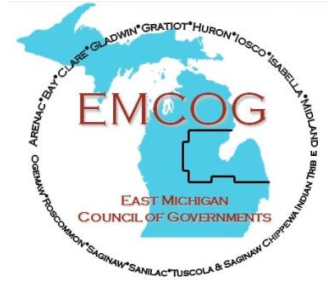

2. NEW – GRANT: CONNECTING DISCARDS, REUSE, AND STEM – Jane Fitzpatrick

EMCOG is a recent recipient of a grant funded through the CERI (Comprehensive Economic Recovery Initiative) supplemental grant awarded to the EDA REI University Center at the MSU Center for Community and Economic Development (whew, that is a mouthful). The scope of the grant is to conduct research to determine opportunities for diversion of discarded materials used in the built environment and in the manufacturing process in the region. There are a number of partners for this initiative that will be providing support for the work. In addition to conducting the project and market feasibility analysis the findings will be presented at a regional workshop late in 2022. 3. REMINDER EMCOG EDA CARES ACT 14 COUNTY REVOLVING LOAN FUND – Jane Fitzpatrick

EMCOG received funding in July, 2020 from the U.S. Department of Commerce EDA to establish a 14-County Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) through the CARES Act. The allocation to EMCOG included approximately \$500,000 for lending for projects which promote business revitalization and growth, enhance workplace safety, strengthen supply chains and sustain and/or create jobs.
