4. **REMINDER** – EDA RECOMPETE PILOT PROGRAM and TECH HUB PROGRAM – Jane Fitzpatrick

Two New EDA Funding Programs:

RECOMPETE Act – a new federal grant program (\$4 Billion) at EDA that will empower persistently distressed communities to develop, implement, and carry out 10-year economic development strategies and create jobs.

Regional Technology and Innovation Hub program – to encourage new and constructive collaborations among local, State, Tribal, and Federal entities, institutions of higher education, the private sector, economic development organizations, labor organizations, nonprofit organizations, and community organizations that promote broad-based regional innovation initiatives.

5. UPDATE – ECONOMIC RESILIENCE DATA: RECOVERY STRATEGY ADDENDUM – Cynthia Edwards

Post COVID-19 data is a consolidation of reporting from various agencies and sources, but it is not official census data. Being an unprecedented global event, we are still trying to interpret the data as best as we can. This data will be presented as an appendix to the official report, as this event was an extreme outlier and requires additional analysis. We are tracking significant demographic shifts that are outside what would normally be expected and can be traced directly back to COVID-19. These changes are happening at a pace that would not be expected in a typical 2-year snapshot of comparable data.

The impacts are not uniform. There are contrasting effects being felt through different industries, some have thrived, some have struggled substantially. There are notable differences on severity in individuals based on economic class and/or race. The data we are compiling and will continue to present will help you identify industries and individuals with the highest needs.

The COVID situation is still very fluid, and information is still coming in daily. We will continue to update your resources for the region as it is received.
